Assignment is to complete an EMS Community Risk Reduction Plan.

Closing the Loop Statement

Capstone/Senior Project Target outcome is 90% of students completing the capstone project with an aggregate score of 9 or higher.

7 students completed the capstone.

- 2 scored a 9.
- 1 scored an 11.
- 4 scored a 12.

7 out of 7 (100%) met the threshold therefore exceeding the 90% target. This was the program's first year and the capstone project expectations were somewhat experimental. In a review of all similar programs across the country, no evidence was found of a similar requirement for a capstone project. Rather than considering this program requirement an outlier, it is more in line with an aspirational document from 2010 published by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration in a report entitled "EMS Agenda for the Future."

<u>Action Plan</u>: Additional work is anticipated by the program chair and the eminently qualified adjunct teaching the course to improve the depth and breadth of each student's plan. PLO's need to be aligned with GLOs.
